2024 Rap Album of the Year Grammy Predictions

-Kanye West, 2013. Inspiring right? Although it seems like winning the Best Rap Album Award is



not exciting to Kanye, for most rappers this award is a big deal! A Grammy is an award that artists can win for releasing the best new pop, rap, and R&B albums or singles. Currently, we are talking about rap albums released throughout 2020-2023. The rappers with the most Grammys are, of course, Kanye West and Jay-Z - with 24 Grammys each. That's so many! Would you like to see who we predict will win the rap Grammy this year? How about what 8th Grade CPMS students think?

Rap Grammys are controversial almost every year. Some fans think artists don't deserve the award and some think that they do. For example, in 2018 Alessia Cara won a Grammy for her song

"1-800-273-8255." According to USATODAY (an online newspaper), several people did not agree with this win, and thought SZA should've been the winner of the award since Alessia won over several artists that are considered to be more popular. The 2024 Rap Grammy Award may be the most debated one since 1995, when the award became a category. This year, well-known and old-fashioned rappers have been nominated. One of the albums that has been nominated for best rap album of the year is Travis Scott's *UTOPIA*, which rapidly gained popularity through many social media apps, like Tiktok and Instagram. Another nomination is *Her Loss*, which was made by Drake and



21 Savage. Like *UTOPIA*, this album also had lots of fame from the music's rhythm, as well as from funny memes. Our personal favorite meme is the one where people edit Drake and 21 Savage when they were featured in the video game WWE. Although these two albums are each very popular, they



are not the only nominees who have a chance of winning. *Heroes & Villains* by Metro Boomin is also nominated. Even though it was released almost a year ago, it is still very popular. In our opinion, despite the fact that this album was released last December - which is the oldest out of all nominees chosen - we think that this album deserves the hype it is receiving because the music is nationally enjoyed. Although the other nominees were not as hyped by a

lot of teenagers, they still are listened to by many adults. *King's Disease III* is the fourth nomination and was created by Nas. This album is filled with inspiring lyrics and great rhythm! Last but not least, we have *Michael* - by Michael Santiago Render - as the final nominee. This album spread a bit more across social media platforms than *King's Disease III*, mainly because Mike's team decided to increase the popularity of the album by adding popular artists to feature in songs. In our opinion, we think this was an amazing decision on their behalf because it features some of our personal favorite artists such as André 3000, Ty Dolla \$ign, and Currensy. Between these two albums, our favorite was *Michael*.

The 2023 Rap Grammys were not as talked about as the 2024 Rap Grammys. For 2023, people generally knew who they wanted to win since all the albums nominated had such different flows. Kendrick Lamar, an iconic rapper, earned Rap Album of the Year in 2023 for his fifth released album, *Mr Morale & the Big Steppers*. This album was the first one Lamar published in 5 years! DJ Khaled's *God Did* was the second album to be nominated last year. This album gained popularity because of social media memes of the album and artist. Future's album was the third to be nominated - *I Never Liked You*. 8th grade students like Daniella Y. think *I Never Liked You* is the best album released since 2020!



Future rose to success by partnering with well-known singers such as The Weeknd, Travis Scott, and even Taylor Swift. Many teens appreciate this album because it gives the impression of being nonchalant, even though (as the title suggests) some of the songs on this album are about Future's heartache! *Come Home The Kids Miss You* is Jack Harlow's fourth nomination, released in May of



2022. The song "First Class" elevated this album to new levels of recognition, but it is not the first time his music has gone viral. He's also become well-known for his collaborations with Lil Nas X, including "Industry Baby" and "Montero". *That's What They All Say*, another album Harlow made was released in December 2022, which contains his second highest rated song, "What's Poppin," which comes just before "First Class." Our personal favorite from Jack Harlow is the song "Already Best Friends" which is in the *Thats What They All Say* album. Pusha T released the Grammy-nominated album *It's Almost Dry*. Pusha T rose to prominence after working with Kanye West on his album *My Beautiful Dark Twisted Fantasy*.

"Runaway", one of Kanye's greatest-selling songs, featured him on it. We personally think "Runaway" is one of Kanye's best songs and feel as if Pusha T's contribution played a big part in making this amazing song.

We decided to survey 8th graders from CPMS. Many 8th graders had doubts about who would win the upcoming Rap Grammys. Since students each have different music tastes, it was interesting to see what everyone chose. Students like Franco G. and Natalie N.

believe that "Utopia may win" because it was "impactful" and "has the best beats". We do think *UTOPIA* has the best beats, but we don't think it was as impactful as other albums. Other students chose "Metro Boomin" because, like Marcus K. says, they "enjoy their music". We agree with Marcus K. because we also enjoy Boomin's music, but we think that *UTOPIA* or *Heroes & Villains* would win. On the other hand, some students, like Emmalin T., chose *Her Loss* (by Drake and 21 Savage) because they, "love this album." Nathaniel C. said, "Though *UTOPIA* may win, *Her Loss* was a way better album beat and flow wise." We respect Nathaniel's opinion but disagree with this statement because we



think *Her Loss* has repetitive beats in many of the songs. Like Nathaniel C., many students think *UTOPIA* will win even though *Her Loss* is their favorite nomination. Students like Timothy V. on the other hand, stated that his favorite album recently released was *For All The Dogs* by Drake, but he also thinks *UTOPIA* will win the Grammy.

The Rap Album Grammy of the Year nominees have had rich history and backstories that amaze some people. An article on Medium, a magazine website, and countless fans, have labeled Nas as one of the best rappers of all time, with roots in East Coast hip hop. Nas, the child of jazz musician Olu Dara, began his musical journey as "Nasty Nas" in 1989, recording for fellow East Coast rapper



Large Professor. Subsequently, he made an appearance on the 1991 song "Live at the Barbeque" by his own group, Main Source. Wikipedia states that Nas released *King's Disease III* in early November of 2022. *King's Disease III* had great critiques from adult audiences, but not many good ones from teen audiences. *King's Disease III* was inspired by Nas' previous albums *King's Disease* and *King's Disease III*. Nas' first hit album, *Illmatic*, won the greatest album award in 1994. Nas collaborated with J-Lo,

Mariah Carey, and Will Smith - and even contributed to Smith's hit song "Gettin' Jiggy Wit It." This song won a Grammy in 1997. This Grammy was Nas' first nomination. He then won another in 1998 with Smith as well.

The very enjoyed album, *Her Loss* was a big hit across platforms. With songs like "The Off-season" by J. Cole, many people love this album. Drake began his career as an actor playing "Jimmy Brooks" on Degrassi: The Next Generation. According to Wikipedia, Drake began his music career in 2006


with his debut mixtape, *Room for Improvement*. Vibe (a magazine that covers rap music) wrote in 2008, "Hip-hop's next Fresh Prince is spitting with all he's got," Drake's career took off after this

record since all of his future albums were tremendous hits. We think these albums do deserve the hype they've been getting through the years, but many songs that are from the same albums can sound incredibly similar to one another. This issue can be shown in *Views* and *Take Care*, for example. Drake and 21 Savage had issues with their album, *Her Loss*. One of Drake and 21 Savage's marketing strategies for *Her Loss* was to produce a fake Vogue cover. This dilemma led to Drake and 21 Savage being sued by Vogue for confusing readers who turn to Vogue for "a voice on fashion and culture." While Drake's attorneys and 21's attorneys are constantly arguing back and forth, the only



thing we've heard about this topic from either of the rappers is a diss from Drake's featured verse on Travis Scott's "MELTDOWN." In this song, Drake raps, "You lucky that Vogue was suing, 'cause I would've been with the Wassas in Paris..."! So far, 21 Savage has not replied!

Despite the fact that Metro Boomin is a producer and not an artist, he is nevertheless extremely



successful because of his music. Boomin's main source of popularity was social media which gained him some attention. Boomin began producing tunes for Future's mixtape 'Streetz Calling' while Boomin was only 18 years old in 2011. Metro Boomin's debut album, 19 & Boomin, was not released until 2013. But, Metro Boomin gained popularity three years later, when he was credited with writing hit songs including Migos' "Bad and Boujee," The Weeknd's "Low Life," and 21 Savage's "X." Our favorite out of these songs is "Low Life". In the same year, he helped Kanye West on *The* Life of Pablo. We think that all of these features with big artists early on in his career show just how much potential these rappers saw in him. Metro Boomin is also one of our favorite music creators, as he features our favorite artists Yogotti, Ace Hood, and Lil Durk. Unfortunately Metro Boomin is going through some

federal issues, and is in jail because of his partner, Young Thug, who was featured several times on the Heroes & Villains album. As Young Thug is being held in jail for a RICO case, Metro tweets that he and "spider" (who is Young Thug) are in custody and will be released later. But Young Thug is not the only one involved in this RICO case; YSL, a record company that includes rappers like Lil Baby, Lil Keed, and Yung Kayo is also involved.

Travis Scott released *UTOPIA* four years after *ASTROWORLD*. *UTOPIA* consists of 19 songs, several including SZA, Drake, Beyonce, and Future. Travis was kicked out of home early in life,

which was a rocky start to his career.

Nevertheless, he moved out to New York to pursue his dream of being a rapper. During the start of Travis's career, Kanye West duplicated *Owl Pharaoh*, Travis' first mixtape. Later, Travis released his debut album, Rodeo, in 2015. Travis went on tour for *Rodeo* where Kanye West and Chris Brown made guest appearances. Travis then released *ASTROWORLD* in 2018, which was so famous that Travis was able to create a digital concert



inside the video game Fortnite! Fortnite is known for hosting such events for several popular artists such as Marshmello, Ariana Grande, and even Eminem! During Travis's virtual concert, he played "SICKO MODE", "STARGAZING", and "goosebumps" which are his most viral songs. Travis has grown so successful that he is the first and only hip-hop artist to sell out at SoFi Stadium. Travis Scott's *ASTROWORLD* incident had a large impact on his career. After releasing *UTOPIA*, in an interview for GQ's Men of the Year Issue, Travis Scott spoke out about what occurred four years ago



on his *ASTROWORLD* Tour. Many people sustained injuries in the audience at Travis's concert in Houston, Texas; eight perished on the scene, and two more died after being hospitalized for the serious injuries received due to crowd stampedes that occurred when Travis allowed fans to get closer to the stage. We found out that Travis has written a song in *UTOPIA*, that is based on the events of his *ASTROWORLD* Tour. About the song "MY

EYES" he states that the lyrics "were very emotional to me" and that he wants people to "know I have pain too." The lyrics that referenced the *ASTROWORLD* Tragedy were "I replay them nights, and right by my side, all I see is a sea of people that ride with me / If they just knew what Scotty would do to jump off the stage and save him a child." Travis Scott is still facing charges because of this incident, so he will be in court in May, 2024.

Michael Santiago Render, also known as Atlanta's rapper, began his career with Outkast's 2000 LP Stankonia, which landed him his first Grammy nomination. In addition, Mike appeared in films like Idlewild and Baby Driver. Mike is mainly known for being half of a famous duo (with El-P) named Run The Jewels. He also founded Grind Time Official Record, which has very talented artists.

According to CBS News, while Mike is not creating music, he takes part in social and political activism, focused on issues such as social injustice, police brutality, and systemic racism. Mike has delivered several talks on the matter at universities, and he has discussed racism in music. Mike was brought out during Lil Baby's performance of *The Bigger Picture* at the 2023 Grammy Awards. The performance was for the purpose of increasing knowledge about abuse of authority by law

enforcement and fighting for equality. We are proud that Lil Baby decided to mention this in his performance, because this is an issue that needs



more awareness from people who teenagers look up to.

The Fight for the Win

There are many high-quality teams that are in the Champions League tournament this season, even though they have not had much success in this competition in the past.

The Champions League is the most important trophy in European football because it determines which is the best club in Europe. Only the very elite teams have won the Champions League Trophy

many times. Qualifying for the Champions League is very hard. Almost every country in Europe has a Champions League spot in their domestic league, which means the league each team competes for in their own country. Earning this spot brings them to the qualifiers, or the start of the actual Champions League tournament. Getting through these qualifiers puts teams into the round of 16. This is a knockout, which means that if they lose, they exit the



Champions League, and can't compete in it until next time. This year, there are huge teams in the competition with little Champions League success; such as Napoli, Paris Saint Germain, Atletico Madrid, and Arsenal. These teams make up 25% of the teams currently in the competition (as of the 9th of January, 2024). In the past, these teams have been very close to winning a Champions League trophy, but they have not done so yet. However, these teams that have not won before are very good right now, so maybe this time they might finally win it! The Champions League is the biggest tournament in Europe in which all clubs compete for the coveted Champions League Trophy.

The first club we will discuss is Napoli, a huge club that hasn't won it yet. Napoli competes in the



Serie A, the Italian league, because they are located in Naples, Italy. Napoli are not so consistent right now, losing to Roma 2-0 and Torino 3-0 in the Serie A. Even though they are down to ninth place this season, Napoli is a great team - winning their league last season. As of January 11th, 2024, Napoli has won 12 Serie A Trophies over the years. Currently in the Champions League, they are facing Barcelona. In the group stage, they have placed second in their Champions League groups, and are one of the favorites to

win the Champions League Trophy. Their most useful players right now are Kravastelia and Victor Oshimen. These people helped them win the Serie A, and get them to their best ever Champions

League run. Historically, Napoli's best Champions League run was last year when they made it to the Quarter Finals, but lost to AC Milan.

Paris Saint Germain plays in the Ligue 1, the French League, because the team is located in Paris, France. Like the other teams specify, they do not have a Champions League Trophy yet. Paris Saint

Germain have signed Lionel Messi, Kylian Mbappe, Neymar Jr, and Angel Di Maria. They came close when they made the Champions League Final in 2020, but lost the Champions League Final to Bayern Munich. They are on a winning streak as of January 7, 2024, Paris Saint Germain won 9-0 against Revel in the French cup, a competition in France where all of the teams in France fight for this trophy. As of November 27, 2023, they also beat Monaco 5-2 in the Ligue 1. On the



12th of January, they are on top of the Ligue 1, with 40 points - leading right now. Paris Saint Germain have eleven Ligue 1 titles. Paris Saint Germain's best players are Kylian Mbappe, who scored a hat trick in the World Cup final, and Kolo Mauni, who scored in the penalty shootout versus Argentina. Paris Saint Germain, also known as the most successful club in France, had some very successful runs in the past; and they are very good right now.

Atletico Madrid is in the Spanish league, the La Liga, and are in fifth place right now. Madrid, Spain,



is where Atletico Madrid is located. They also have never won a Champions League Trophy before. Atletico Madrid have made the Champions League Final before, when they lost to Real Madrid. Atletico's best players right now are Diego Godin and Antoine Griezmann, who became the man of the match in a World Cup Final, and Digeo Godin, who was at Villareal before Atletico Madrid. Also, the team has won ten Copa del Rey competitions, and two Supercopas de Españas. Atletico are in good form beating Almeria 1-0, Malcorra 1-0, and

Sevilla 1-0 in the La Liga. As of January 10th, 2024, they have lost to Real Madrid CF 3-5 in the Supercopas de España Semi Finals. Atletico Madrid won 11 titles from 1939 to 2021.

Arsenal is located in London (England), and compete in the Premier League. They have also not won any Champions League Trophies yet. Their best players right now are Declan Rice and Martin Odeggard, who are both helping Arsenal to do very well in the Premier League. Historically, their best Champions League run was losing the final to Barcelona in 2006. Their success in domestic cups is very impressive. Arsenal have won 17 FA cups, and 17 Community Shields. Arsenal have won three Premier League titles up to date right now. As of January 11th, 2024, Arsenal's best players are Bukayo Saka, and Martin Oddegard, who have the most shots on goal so far in this season.

And that's all of the info that you need to know about these teams without any Champions League Trophies.

According to the United States Now website - from an organization that shares information about the wonders of the United States - the standard household in America spends almost \$3,000 each year eating at restaurants. We have asked the 8th grade community their favorite place to eat out and have found out that the top destination for our hungry Tigers is... In-N-Out!

When was the last time you ate at a fancy restaurant? Did you go to your favorite location and get food you love? Well, we surveyed the 8th grade class here at CPMS to figure out the most popular restaurant in our grade. We tallied the votes we obtained and the winner for the favorite restaurant is...drum roll please...Din Tai Fung!! The restaurant - located in the UTC mall, as well as many



other places around the world - received the most votes. Now, 7% of the votes may sound low, and that's because it is! Because our survey results included such a vast pool of different choices, one establishment receiving 7% of the votes was the top of the board. These votes that went to Din Tai Fung - coming from Daniella Y., Alaina Y., and Faith E. - made it the single most popular restaurant our 8th graders eat at. When we asked why, Daniella Y. kept it simple, saying that she "loves the food." Other

restaurants that acquired two votes each, are the steakhouse Ruth's Chris, the Chinese chain restaurant PF Chang, the restaurant and brewhouse BJ's, the sushi places Narumi and Tappi, and the Texan and Southern style steakhouse Texas Roadhouse. Personally, out of these, we would choose Narumi as the top pick, but unfortunately, it didn't come first among the votes of my peers.

Din Tai Fung was number one in the restaurant category, so here is some information about how it came to be. According to Din Tai Fung's official website, the restaurant became an establishment due to a man named Mr. Bing-Yi Yang who was born in China in 1927. When Yang was 20 years old, he migrated to Taiwan with 20 dollars in his pockets. In Taiwan, Yang founded a shop selling cooking oil and came up with the name, Din Tai Fung. The shop sold Xiao Long Bao, the dumplings with heated soup and pork inside, which became very popular. Yang then made Din Tai Fung into the restaurant everyone loves and enjoys. This restaurant has



earned lots of awards, including the coveted "Michelin Star at its Hong Kong branch". The Michelin Star is a prestigious award given only to the best of the best. The Star means that the restaurant has high quality food and standards day in and day out. The restaurant has become a worldwide famous brand, serving people all around the world in the "United States, Japan, South Korea, Singapore, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, Australia, Europe, and Thailand." In-N-Out is special in many ways to us Californians. To many people across the state, the name represents that flavorful burger we all love. It's that delicious burger paired with their signature fries that keeps us running back for more. Sitting in one of those red booths just evokes great times eating their food. The runner up in the fast food category was Raising Cane's - with 13 votes. The delicious fried chicken from Cane's - and their signature sauce - have taken over 20% of the votes from our 8th grade community. Alaina Y. likes Cane's because both "...their chicken tenders and their

sauce" are delicious. Although fried chicken isn't healthy, we dream of a world where we all could eat fried chicken all day and stay skinny. After Cane's, two fast food restaurants that came in tied for third place were McDonalds and Chick-Fil-A, each with 8 votes. Chick-Fil-A we happily support making the top three. But, what was the thought process in choosing McDonalds? Do students like the soggy burgers? Or maybe the always-broken ice cream machine? For whatever reason, it tied for third with Chick-Fil-A. We disagree with these opinions about McDonalds, but every single other fast food restaurant we can agree with being on top of these charts.

With an empty stomach and palm trees swaying in the wind, the smell of the delicious burgers wafting out the door, along with the smell of their fresh fries, makes you even hungrier than before. Because of the great food they provide, and that In-N-Out is so popular among the CPMS students, we thought we would research how In-N-Out became so successful. We learned that In-N-Out was founded in 1948 by Harry Snyder. According to the official website for the company, In-N-Out's trademark symbol is that at every location two palm trees cross each other. Also, In-N-Out was the first ever drive-thru burger place in California. In 1948, In-N-Out made a speaker box to get the customers orders very quickly and efficiently. Animal Style (the mix



of grilled onions and extra spread) was added in the year 1961, and is an important part of In-N-Out's history. In 1963, In-N-Out introduced the double-double burger to the world. The double-double burger is a regular burger except with an extra patty: just what everyone wants to satisfy their needs. Many In-N-Out customers requested they add milkshakes to the menu; and in 1975 they received chocolate, vanilla, and strawberry milkshakes! Almost 20 years later, In-N-Out established its 100th property. Four years after that was its 50th anniversary. The students of 8th grade at College Prep are only a small part of the profuse amount of people who love In-N-Out.

How many times have you experienced the delights of going to Cane's? Once? Twice? 50 times? Well, however many times you have been there, have you ever thought about how Cane's came to



be? As you walk into Cane's, the whiff of fried chicken and a buttery garlic bread hits. You come to sit down at their marble top table and wait for your number to be called. With great chicken, Raising Cane's is the second most popular place, so we researched this establishment as well. From Under 30 CEO - a business that aims to help people have financial success in their lives - we have found out that Cane's was introduced in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in 1996, and only sold chicken fingers. Todd Graves, who currently owns 90% of the Raising Cane's business, is the original founder. By 2013, Raising Cane's introduced their famous chicken sandwiches. About 400 locations were opened by

2019 and their profit came to \$1.18 billion. In 23 years Cane's was able to accumulate over a billion dollars from selling chicken. Who knows how much they will make in the future. Cane's came pretty close to In-N-Out, but 13 votes is still a big difference. We believe that if Cane's was even comparable to In-N-Out, the votes would be closer. But, they aren't, and that is why In-N-Out is on top!

McDonalds is a very popular fast food restaurant to many people around the globe. Lots of people like it and so do the 8th grade students at CPMS as it is tied for top 3 in the CPMS 8th grade. Thanks to the Encyclopedia, Britannica, we know that the first ever drive-through McDonald's was opened

in 1940 by brothers Maurice and Richard McDonald in California. At the start of 1949, they had a hamburger bundle on their menu for only \$0.15. This bundle included a shake or drink, hamburger, and fries. This bundle seems like a steal if it was only 15 cents present day, but back then 15 cents equals about \$2.00 today, which is still a steal of a deal! Canada was their first out-of-country location in 1967. A year later, McDonald's introduced the Big Mac to its menu. This very famous hamburger became the company's second best selling element on their menu, after their french fries. By 1998,



McDonald's moved past the hamburger and cheeseburger business by purchasing the famous Chipotle Mexican Grill and the pizzeria Danatos in 1999. McDonalds had more than 34,000 outlets in 115 different countries around the world by 2000. Over the years, McDonalds has grown their menu, adding items like Filet-O-Fish sandwiches, Quarter Pounders, Egg McMuffins, Happy Meals,

and their world famous Chicken McNuggets. By 2018, McDonalds came out with vegan burgers. This company became one of the largest fast food restaurants with over 2 million employees. According to Britanica, these employees are at over 40,000 locations world-wide. McDonalds, although coming tied in third with Chick-Fil-A, is also the most overrated fast food restaurant on our list. So for all of you McDonalds lovers out there, why? That is our main question. MYSTERIOUS MUSICAL MECHANISMS

Imagine walking into a music store and you see an instrument you have never seen or heard of. You reach over to try playing it and you think to yourself, where have I heard this sound before? Maybe in a song, maybe a video game, or maybe even a movie. You then go home and figure out that the instrument you just used isn't even from this country, even though it sounds very similar to instruments you're more familiar with. Maybe all instruments are more familiar than you think!

Instruments are the foundation of all music, and we all recognize the distinct sound and versatility of the guitar; the classic, ear-pleasing sound of the piano; and the crashes and thumps of the drums; which many love. But what about the less familiar instruments? The ones that may only be familiar to the country of origin or cultures that traditionally use them? Instruments such as the sitar, tabla, marimba, castanet, kokyu, and hamisen



are far less familiar here in America, but many of these actually aren't too far from more familiar instruments - whether the similarity is the sound or appearance. You also may be surprised to learn that some of these exotic instruments are actually featured in musical tracks you have heard before. Though unfamiliar at first glance, these instruments are more recognizable than they originally seemed to be.

The sitar is a stringed instrument, originating in India and dating back to the 18th century. It is a wooden instrument that features a neck, a body, 19 strings, and 19 tuners as the main structure. The sitar can be compared to a guitar as it is a stringed instrument that is played in a similar manner, though the sitar has more strings than a traditional guitar. Another comparable instrument to the sitar would be the harp, as a simple harp can feature around 17-22 strings, akin to a sitar (according to the Encyclopedia Britannica). The sound qualities of a sitar are recognizable, and can be described as



having a distinct sharp and buzzing tone. The sound can also be compared to a 12-string Rickenbacker guitar famously used by The Byrds, The Smiths, R.E.M, and other artists of the Indie and Jangle Pop genres. The sitar was very popular in western music in the 1960s, and a profuse amount of well-known songs featured the sitar. Examples include The Beatles "Norwegian Wood," and The Rolling Stones "Paint it Black." One thing that makes this instrument very cool and interesting is its ability to fit into western music, usually

playing the role of the guitar, even though it was not originally intended to serve that purpose.

Like the sitar, the tabla also hails from India in the 18th century, though this one is a percussion (an instrument that is struck to be played) instrument. The tabla is a single-headed, wooden drum. The tabla shares many architectural qualities with the bongo drum, being of comparable shape and

material. The main difference between the tabla and the bongo is that the bongo is double-headed.

The sound of the tabla can be described as a soothing, low, light thump that reverberates. An instrument with comparable sound qualities to the tabla is the conga from the Caribbean, which also produces a light thump that's just as pleasant to the ear. Another percussion instrument with a louder thumping sound is the tom, which produces an almost identical hollow tone. The tabla, just like the sitar, was popular in western music in the 1960s, where it was used in diverse ways in songs like The Beatles calming "Love You To" and Led Zeppelin's heavier "Black Mountain Side." One thing that makes the tabla a fascinating



instrument is its versatility. For example, it could be used in calm, soft music; or in harder, heavier music - yet it never sounds out of place.

The marimba is a mallet percussion instrument, which first debuted in the 14th century. Historians

have debated where exactly the marimba originated, and have narrowed it down to either stemming from Africa or Southeast Asia. Architecturally, the marimba features wooden bars that each contain a resonator pipe which amplifies the sound produced by each hit of the mallet. The marimba shares many of its qualities with its fellow mallet percussion instruments: the xylophone and vibraphone, each of which also feature bars struck by mallets. The main difference between the marimba and the other two being the resonator pipes ([according to Wikipedia] they are large pipes connected to each bar),

and the sizes of the instruments, the marimba being the biggest and the xylophone being the smallest. The sound of a marimba can be described as bassy, echoey, and powerful. The tone is strikingly similar to the aforementioned xylophone and vibraphone due to being made of almost identical material, and having a comparable design. Musically, the marimba has been used in a wide variety of

songs and jingles throughout many decades. This abundance of songs includes The Rolling Stones' "Under My Thumb" and The Beach Boys' "All Summer Long" from the 1960s, and The Cure's "The Lovecats" from the 1980s. The marimba can also be heard in the unforgettable default Apple IOS ringtone



from the 21st century - a tune which is recognized all around the world! One thing about the marimba that is appealing is that it's a simple instrument, but it is able to create a wide catalog of recognizable and impressive tunes and jingles.

Castanets are also a percussion instrument, but these originated in Latin America, and were first created over 3000 years ago - way back in the Bronze Age! The castanet is composed of two hollow, wooden circles tied together at the top. When you shake the string, the circles will collide, projecting a clicking noise. If done with correct timing, this action produces a rhythm. A related instrument is the clappers, which is also a handheld instrument that features wood tied together like the structure of a castanet. The pivotal difference between the two is the shape of a clapper, which is rectangular,

compared to the round shape of the castanets. The castanet has a very intriguing sound that shares very few qualities with other instruments. The sound of a castanet can be compared to the sound of



hitting a wood block, or the rim of a drum played repeatedly; only more staccato (which is a musical term for a short and quick sound), and with a more consistent and precise sound. In a song, the castanet fulfills the role of a rhythm instrument usually complimenting the drums, allowing it to be used in songs from various genres. A few songs made with these instruments are "The Logical Song" by Supertramp, "Be My Baby" by The Ronettes, and "Rebel Rebel" by David Bowie. The castanet is an exotic percussion instrument, consisting of a unique sound and shape that makes it, all in all, a

very interesting tool of music.

The shamisen and kokyu are both stringed instruments that originate from Okinawa, Japan in the 16th century. The shamisen has a sleek appearance consisting of a lightweight square-shaped hollow wood body with striking white paint on it. The design of the shamisen and the kokyu also includes three pegs on the top of the instruments turned to tighten the strings for tuning. The



kokyu, on the other hand, has an oval-shaped body and three strings with a tuner for each. Though very similar, the two instruments have two key differences: The kokyu uses a bow-like accessory, while the shamisen requires a hawk talon-shaped plectrum called a bachi which fulfills a similar role to a guitar pick (according to Britannica). An instrument similar to the shamisen is the banjo because they are played diagonally and both have a similar white oval-shaped body. While the kokyu is similar to the cello as they are both played vertically with a bow. Though the instruments use different accessories to produce sound, both instruments have a lovely but sharp buzzing tone akin to the sound of a biwa (another Japanese instrument), the electric viola, and the electric violin. The shamisen also sounds like a guitar and a banjo: sharing a similar acoustic tone to each of these stringed instruments. Though similar in certain aspects, the two instruments also have many



differences. For instance, when played, one full strum from the shamisen produces a quick sound that gradually dies down as the bachi is taken away from the strings. Alternatively, when one full note of the kokyu is played, it is constant and doesn't die down until the bow is removed from the instrument, similar to other instruments played with bows. Though they were "big in Japan," neither instrument has been featured in a large variety of western music.

Interestingly, both are included in "Aqueous Transmission" by Incubus (released in 2001). The shamisen and kokyu are each very uniquely-designed. Even though each resembles common western instruments, they take their own spin on the sound and architecture, making them ear-catching.

These fascinating instruments are not commonly recognized in western culture, but they each offer an unforgettable shock of amazing sounds and notes to those who play and listen to these instruments. But to the readers, are they unfamiliar no more? Or are these just as intriguingly head-scratching as they were when you first learned of the instruments? That's up for you to decide.

Mexican Traditions

Honor), where the girl is supported by her damas (girls) and chambelanes (boys), who dance at the ceremony. Damas and chambelanes can be your close friends, cousins, siblings, or even people who are just hired to be part of your Quince court. The damas and chambelanes are an important part of the Quinceanera. Also at a Quinceanera, there is traditionally a mass at a church and then a party after, which includes dancing, followed by the surprise gift, which could be anything! The shoes change, showing the transition to womanhood from girlhood. The shoe change is an important part of the Quinceanera because it shows the girl is ready to transition from girl to woman. There is a "last doll" that the Quinceanera will receive. A Quniceanera represents the giving up of childhood, according to the

Encyclopedia Britannica. A Quinceanera is fun to go to because of the excitement and joy on this special day for a young woman.

Another Mexican tradition is Dia De Los Muertos (Day of the Dead). This tradition happens on November 1st and 2nd each year. On the Dia De Los Muertos, people celebrate the family members or friends who have passed away. November 1st is the day people under the age of eighteen are remembered on this special day because of their passing. On November 2nd, we celebrate people who were older than nineteen when they passed away. People traditionally make an altar

(ofrenda) showing pictures of the people who have passed. A person can purchase a type of bread called "Pan de Muerto," which is only sold around the time of Dia De Los Muertos. 




The Climate Change Catastrophe

Imagine global warming has taken over the planet. Hurricanes and floods batter the Earth, destroying




countless communities and deposits of saved money. Glaciers have melted in the Arctic, causing oceans to rise, demolishing one trillion dollars of coastline homes and communities. Crops are dying due to droughts, causing shortages of food. Everyone wishes that they had put a little more effort in maintaining our once-beautiful planet, so they could have prevented the devastating state of Earth. Climate change could cause all these problems in the future. According to NASA, climate change is a long-term change in Earth's weather patterns that can lead to some serious

impacts - including extreme weather, sea-level rising, temperatures rising, and many other distressing results. Though many CPMS student make an effort to prevent climate change, it is important for all of us to be well-informed of the severity of this event, and try to help make less of an impact wherever possible

Part of the reason climate change has developed into such a vast problem is because of humans. The greenhouse gas effect is a big contributor to climate change. According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (the NOAA is a government agency that regulates and researches the

ocean and atmosphere), people have been adding the harmful gas, CO² (otherwise known as carbon dioxide) into the atmosphere through burning fossil fuels and deforestation. These actions have increased the amount of carbon dioxide in our atmosphere by 50% since 1750. Humans also release other harmful gasses into the atmosphere like methane, nitrous oxide, and chlorofluorocarbons. These greenhouse gasses escape into our atmosphere through leaks in fossil fuel production, transportation, fertilizer production, clearing of land, and objects with chlorofluorocarbons that don't meet the international Montreal Protocol. According to



NASA, this Protocol is an international agreement to protect the ozone layer of the atmosphere by

limiting the chlorofluorocarbons emission that contribute to greenhouse gasses. Releasing these gasses into the atmosphere may not appear to be a pressing problem because the atmosphere is made up of gasses. However, according to National Geographic, these harmful gasses can lead to global warming because they trap the sun's rays in Earth's atmosphere, which raises the global temperature over time. Creating and releasing greenhouse gasses has become a crucial part of creating things we need like energy. However, by continuing to pollute the atmosphere instead of finding cleaner ways to create resources, we could leave greater problems for future generations to solve.

Climate change affects the Earth in many ways. One effect of climate change is weather patterns changing constantly, which can affect food sources and crops. It can also lead to extreme floods, as shown by recent examples from Australia. A week before the New South Wales flood on November 14th, they saw nearly 2 inches of water caused by the rain. People in Victoria and many people in South Wales saw about 4.6 inches of rainfall on November 13th-14th. This exceptional amount of




rain caused rivers and lakes to rise and flood towns nearby to lakes and rivers. During the first few months of 2022, Sydney had seen about a year's worth of rain.

Climate change could also cause extreme tropical cyclones that do a lot of damage to the community and their health. In 1970, The Bhola Cyclone hit east of Pakistan. This cyclone started around November 8th, it lasted about 4 days and made quite an impact on the east of Pakistan. This cyclone's cost was almost 90 million

dollars from all the damages! Sadly, 500,000 people died because of this cyclone. We can still try to fix climate change so these cyclones do not cause a lot of damage.

Glacier melting is another result of climate change. A recent report of this happening from The Guardian (a British newspaper) tells us about the European Alps glaciers that have lost a third of their size due to global warming. During the summer of 2022, the Alps glaciers suffered through a huge heatwave, with temperatures up to 86°F - which caused a rise in the elevation at which water freezes. This elevation was higher than Mont Blanc, resulting in a significant drop in the glacier's size. In the year 2100, the Alps glaciers will lose 80% of their ice if we continue to trap heat in the

atmosphere through greenhouse gas emissions. Even if action is taken to stop greenhouse gasses, the ones already in the atmosphere will sadly continue to shrink our glacier. We have caused lots of irreversible damage to the Earth that we don't even know about. Every action has consequences, so if we want to save glaciers and other parts of Earth from damage, it is important we find cleaner ways to produce the goods and services we need.

There is also a much bigger result of climate change called global warming. Global warming is when the Earth's surface temperatures start to rise, resulting in an increase in temperature, more droughts, and difficulty growing crops. Storms can become more severe with intense rainfall, leading to more flooding, compounded by clogged drains or blocked off areas and places like lakes, rivers, and ponds. These elements conspire to cause a lot of water buildup and water with nowhere to go, must overflow and flood the area. When a big storm or a flood hits, it costs a lot to repair the damage done. For example, in 2005, Hurricane Katrina hit southeast Louisiana. After this hurricane it was very hard to repair the damages, the cost came up to about 186.3 billion dollars. So if climate change gets too bad, it could be too late to help fix the cause and most people will live in poverty as our



money is used to repair the copious amount of damages.

Some ways to help prevent climate change require big adjustments in our lives, like burning less fossil fuel. Other solutions are easy things that everyone can do, like walking instead of using a vehicle to travel places. Some everyday habits each of us should build include using less electricity, like turning off the light when you're not in

the room, or not leaving the air conditioner on all day. Leaving the TV on all day or when you sleep can also be a waste of electricity. This might not seem much, but it can contribute to making the cost of electricity more expensive. We can build habits to be less wasteful. Even small contributions can amount to big changes.


Using renewable resources, like solar power, is a great example of a way to help prevent climate change. Other renewable resources you can use include cloth-made bags, reusing old clothing and cutting down on wasteful objects rather than using useless objects like plastic bags, extra packaging, and plastic water bottles that are wasteful and harmful to the community. The US Environmental Protection Agency - the EPA is a government agency focused on protecting the environment - explains that transporting and cleaning water for our home takes energy that contributes to greenhouse gasses. According to the California Department of Water Resources (part of the California Natural Resources government agency that regulates water use in California) there has been a recent drought in California from 2012 to 2016, which caused drinking water shortages. These

shortages mean we need to transport more water to our homes from further away, contributing to greenhouse gasses. When people leave the water running while waiting for the water to get hot, it is a waste of both water and electricity. We can save gallons of water by taking shorter showers, and by doing simple maintenance like fixing leaks in our homes. Most teens don't pay attention to their water use.

However, wasting water has a big

impact. The abundance of water needed in most gardens also contributes to greenhouse gas emissions. Instead of growing water-loving plants, we can try to create gardens full of plants adapted to the climate and weather of our area, and only water them when required to. Los Angeles Times (the sixth largest newspaper in the United States, that has won more than 40 Pulitzer Prizes - awards for journalism and newspapers) gives many examples of native plants of Southern California like



Blue grama grass, Silver Carpet Aster, Yankee Point Carmel Ceanothus, Dara's Choice Sage, Hummingbird sage. These look beautiful in a garden, but also are adapted to the Southern California climate.

Another solution to prevent climate change that is recommended by the National Park Service (a government agency that manages national parks and monuments) and the EPA is looking for the ENERGY STAR certified label. The ENERGY STAR certified label is found on appliances like refrigerators, freezers,

dishwashers and more. These appliances save money on energy. If the entire United States only used the ENERGY STAR certified models, \$15 billion dollars would be saved on energy with 175 million tons less greenhouse gas emissions. If everyone were to pitch in just a little bit of help, it could do a lot to change the impact of climate change. This could really help save the Earth from climate change and overall make Earth a better place.

Clearly, based on all the research presented so far, climate change is a huge problem on Earth. However, does everyone know that? Though climate change is a serious issue, CPMS students admit that they don't know much about it. Liana O. explains that though we do learn about climate change in school "there may be some details of climate change teenagers aren't aware of." Jacob A. agrees saying, "it is not a major thing discussed at school or at home." George B. and Henry A. argue some teenagers are well-informed because of non-profit organizations and social media. Though most students have some background knowledge on climate change, we could still strive to learn more about this topic. If more people are well-educated about our contributions to climate change, we could find ways in our lives to help prevent it.

Students do use the information they have learned about climate change to make their own opinion on the severity of this event. More than 50% percent of the grade have a lot of hope for the future



and believe that climate change is "just another problem we need to overcome." Alex S. describes climate change as a "Moderate" problem, likely to be solved. Jacob A. agrees when he says "It is just another problem to overcome, because the majority of humans will be able to live on with their normal lives." Grace B. and Benjamin R. suggest that if everyone took action to prevent climate change we can save our Earth. It is great that so many 8th graders are hopeful that we can end climate change. But, we should still fully understand how serious this event is and keep trying to prevent bad outcomes.

On the other hand, less than 50% of the grade is very concerned about climate change and believe it could be the "end of the world." Students like Branden B. are very passionate that climate change may cause the end of the world. His reply to our survey included block capitals, multiple exclamation marks, and even phrases like "mass extinction" - all to convey the urgency he feels about this topic. Some students like Stephen O. feel overwhelmed by climate change and explain that if we can't stop this problem "it keeps getting bigger and bigger," causing more harm. Henry A. summed up this feeling by describing climate change as a "Very large" problem. Many students like Katelyn U. are concerned that it will soon be "too late to fix" the damage of climate change. Other 8th graders agreed and described many negative effects they are worried about in the future. Neveah

K., Timmy V., Gia J., and Jayne B. are concerned about the melting glaciers in the Arctic. Gia J. is anxious about the possibility of "San Diego becoming an island." Thankfully, it is unlikely that San Diego will become an island anytime soon. But according to the NOAA, the sea levels are rising from glaciers melting, the ocean warming causing the ocean to expand, and the water that is taken from groundwater



deposits ending up in the ocean. This could cause higher tide flooding in coastal cities like San Diego. Other students like Isabel A., Giovannie Z., Katelyn U., and Alice D., care about the outcome of animals through climate change. Katelyn U. believes that "Climate change will inevitably lead to animal extinctions." A lot of people in the world believe this could lead to a sixth mass extinction. The Natural History Museum in Balboa Park contends that we actually already are in a sixth mass-extinction event because of climate change. Natural disasters like floods and wildfires may become more common in 50 years. By trying to prevent this change, we could decrease the destruction of habitats for species.

Students have already decided to take action in their own life to prevent these outcomes. CPMS students like Rachel Q., Timmy V., and Henry A. reduce their use of gas by walking or biking to places instead of asking a parent to drive them. Xiomara O. also reduces her energy use by using "energy efficient electricity." Climate change is slowly destroying the Earth we know and love. But by making small efforts we can all help stop this negative change on Earth.

It is clear that climate change is a tragic burden on Earth. Releasing greenhouse gasses leads to a profusion of problems including flooding, melting glaciers, and cyclones. It is imperative that each of us make an effort to prevent climate change by being less wasteful of resources. If something is not done now, we will leave greater problems for the next generation to solve. The future of the Earth is in our hands.

professional player. Players also need ambition to be the best, which does not come easy; it requires years of failure and losses and the resilience to bounce back from them to even come close to a professional career.


What is Soccer?

It should be made clear that basketball is one of the most injury-filled sports in the world. A journalist named Danielle Clark - from Weekend.com (a sports research company) - researched all



types of basketball injuries all over the body and how long it takes to recover from the injury. One example that the journalist provided was a torn Achilles, which can occur when the player steps really hard in a certain direction. This injury can take up to 10 months to recover fully from, which is longer than most injuries. Meanwhile, soccer also has the same risks, which includes those career ruining injuries. Cost of Playing Soccer and Basketball

The cost of playing soccer or basketball isn't cheap. According to hoopsaddict.com, a well-known

basketball website, a basketball player can expect to spend anywhere between 400 and 4,000 dollars a year on AAU (Amateur Athletic Union) basketball. According to a doctor named Shu-Kun Lin at a sports journalism website



LeBron James are regarded as some of the best athletes to ever play each sport, which is why their pay is way higher than that of the average professional athlete in these sports. Meanwhile, the average rookie salary in the NBA is \$953,000 for their first year, according to ESPN. com, a sports news website. A rookie player in the MLS normally receives from \$1 million a year to \$500k, according to the MLS Players Association.

What Do 8th Graders at CPMS Think About Soccer and Basketball?

Basketball and soccer are both great sports, but each has its own unique craft. Soccer and basketball are similar sports because they both require cardio, strength, and hand-eye coordination. 

artists. But, early in his career Savage received backlash for singing like a mumble rapper. This means that when he would sing he sounded like he was mumbling. He overcame this later in his career. In 2016, he dropped his album, *E.PSavage Mode*. It was a big success, most notably the song, "Bank Account." This song at its highest reached number 2 on Billboard's top 200 chart. In 2018, he released his second studio album, *I am* >*I*, was. It had many huge names on the album like Travis

Scott, J. Cole, Lil Baby, and Offset. This album was yet another success. Such a success, that his song "A lot," featuring J. Cole won a grammy for best rap song. By this point, Savage had received mainstream attention and was respected by many artists. Most recently he made an album with Drake called, *Her Loss*. We've been talking about all these popular artists, but many big name producers help to make these songs. We will list the top three producers of 2023 according to the website, hiphopdx. This is a



respected website because it is very well-known in the Hip Hop industry, and has a large following on many platforms. They produced a list in which they listed the nominees for the best producers in 2023, providing information about the artists and why they deserve the award. First on the list is BNYX. He is a newer producer but has made a name for himself in the industry. He has worked with big artists such as Drake, Yeat, Offset, Travis Scott, and Lil Uzi Vert. It wasn't always like this though. According to hiphopdx, BNYX dropped out of college and had to work at an AT&T store to provide for himself. It was during this time when he

garden, which we think is very cool. In conclusion, all of these restaurants have amazing and uncommon food items we don't usually see like the Bacalhau at Lumi Rooftop!

But when should you go to these places? The best seasons to travel, according to our research, would be autumn and spring. This is when there are fewer crowds, which means that you can have more time to do activities, like going to the beach. However, in our research from Expat Explore, a blog website that explains the best times to travel and where to go during

those times, we found that the Northern Hemisphere's high season (June-August) would be a good time to travel. High season is when tourism is at its busiest, while in the low season (November-February), tourism decreases and traveling usually becomes more inexpensive. This all depends on if you like to travel during the high or low season. For example if you want to avoid the crowds and like more chilly weather, then traveling in the low season is the way to go. If you like the

spring and summer weather, like the busy crowds, and want to get the full tourist experience, then high season is your best choice.

A big thing that people might want to pay attention to is that when you travel in high season the hospitality staff pays more attention to the people because there are more people in that place, which can lead to bad things happening. The staff is also



more prepared and geared up to help their visitors. But also there is more attending staff during high season in places like hotels, restaurants, and activities like tours around that place. Also based on our research from Expat Explore, the low season's hospitality staff won't be as meticulous because there are fewer crowds, which impacts the ability of workers to earn as much money as in the high season..

We prefer traveling in the high season because that is where the best weather is and where the best service comes in. We also like the high season because of the full tourist experience. Overall, where you want to travel depends on you; there are advantages and disadvantages to each.

We also collected some data from the 8th grade CPMS students about the different activities they like while traveling, the restaurants CPMS students like to eat at, and the times they like to travel. In summer, many of our 8th graders prefer going to Hawaii. Tara B. gives a reason for this: "Hawaii has a beautiful beach and many more fun experiences." Miah M. agrees: "Hawaii has cool sites to visit." Mexico is also a very popular summer destination. Delina K. said that Mexico "is tropical" and Chanel B. agrees that Mexico is "very tropical and nice." The main motivations for student selection of favorite destinations was if there is "nice weather" in that place, or because "family lives there."

Some students prefer winter destinations. Salm S., Chloe B., and Victoria E. all like going to Big Bear because of the snow. Others - like Giovannie Z., Jayne B., and Celine A. - prefer winter destinations like Mammoth, South Dakota, and New York. They like going to these places for similar reasons, which include snow. A lot of students chose a favorite winter



destination because "family lives there." For example, Jayne B. chose this reason for enjoying visits to South Dakota.

Some of the author's favorite summer destinations include Hawaii and Bora Bora, because these places are very tropical and have a lot of summer activities that visitors can do - like going scuba diving in clear ocean waters. For winter destinations, we like to go to places where it snows like Big Bear, as well as cities like New York that have fun activities like sledding in Central Park, and walking around to see all of the Christmas displays.



We also asked about students' top three best restaurants in the United States that they have eaten at. The results were mixed. Some students, like Chloe B., Hailey I., and Kamryn D. (and many more!) ranked steakhouses like Ruth Chris and Hell's Kitchen as their favorite restaurants to eat in the United States. However, many people like Gia J. and Timmy V. prefer to go to sushi restaurants like Nobu, Konichiwa Sushi, and Bamboo Tai.

As the authors of this article, our opinions differ. One author (Grace B.) likes to eat at fancy steakhouses because she likes steak; while the other author (Faith E.) prefers going to sushi restaurants because she likes seafood and the taste of sushi. Some of our recommendations are the steak restaurants Ruth's Chris, Flemings, and Mastro's; as well as sushi restaurants Nobu and Bambu.

Our results for what place students like to visit out of the United States were also mixed. A lot of students, including Roman G. and Rory K. said that the best place to travel out of the United States is Mexico. Other students like Abigail M., Drake H., and Layla H. like places that have more summer

weather like Bali, Cancun, and the Bahamas. An interesting response came from Yousif A., who "really liked visiting Turkey." Turkey is a nice place to go to if you would like to try some Turkish cuisine and go to some of the famous markets there like the Grand Bazaar, which is Turkey's oldest and largest market.

In conclusion, there were many students who liked to travel and eat at similar places, but most opinions differed. Some places out of the U.S. we would like to go to are places in London and Barcelona because of the atmosphere and vibe. Or maybe Brazil, because of the weather and natural beauty. Or Italy, for its amazing Italian food and its architecture. Maybe our dream is France, because of the unique desserts like their



macaroons. Also, most importantly, to visit the Eiffel Tower and go to the first floor, second floor, and the summit to experience the restaurants and the amazing views of Paris.

A Musical Fish

Do you need to listen to some calm, relaxing music about praising God? Music that also mixes in life

struggles? Have you ever heard of Montell Fish?

Montell Fish is a religious musician who sings about God, relationships, and feelings. His music is a mix of R&B, soul and hip-hop. The beginning of his career was in early 2010, but he didn't start releasing music to Spotify until 2015. He's been making music since 2010 about his life struggles - including love and problems with addiction. The meaning and style of his songs allowed him to express himself thoroughly, and



also to do what he loves. Montell released albums yearly until 2019, were he took a three-year break until 2022, but after 2022 he hasn't released another album as a single in 2023. His last album landed him in hot water with his fans and Christians that educated themselves on the subject, but he still maintains a huge audience. Montell Fish continues to express his feelings and struggles through singing gospel music.

Who is Montell Fish? Montell Fish is a religious, deep, lyrical, and heavy-hearted musician and



songwriter - who gets roughly 10 million monthly listeners on Spotify alone! When he was 16, his mom kicked him out of her house because of his constant disobedience and addiction. famousbirthdays.com - a biography website that has a multitude of information about famous people compiled from primary sources - continues the story: "At the age of 17, he "found God" and used his depression to write music." Let'sgo back to the beginning. Montell was born in Pittsburgh, PA on October 19th, 1997. Now, 26 years old, Montell Fish makes music based on his struggles in life like heartbreaks, addiction, and depression. Most of his early music was based around Christianity, but recently he's included messages about his

newest heartbreaks too. Montell might have added a new theme, but he continued to make the same style of slow and meaningful lyric-filled music.

A big part of Montell's career and life is his relationship with Christianity. The biography of Montell posted on famous birthdays.com explains how, "Montell started to grow his relationship with

Christianity when he was 17." When his mom saw these efforts, she allowed him to live with her again. He attended Church with his mom and stepdad, and continued to practice Christianity to further learn about the rules and teachings of Jesus and God. Highsnobiety.com - a digital magazine that's focused on global fashion and lifestyle - published an article focused on Montell's art. This




piece quotes Montell as saying, "On my mom's side there was a lot of gospel, a lot of religious music." Billboard.com (a website that reports on music) includes Montell's claim that "I'd be at my mom's house – no explicit video games or music, we're going to church every Sunday, gospel music in the house." Billboard.com also elaborates on how Montell wanted to take his title as a Christian seriously, and to truly give himself to God. He found hope, peace, and comfort in believing in God. He had been struggling with depression and addiction for a long time, and in following what the Bible says, he was able to get better. Montell studied the Bible and made sure to try his best to maintain following the moral codes. This led him to release his first song


to Spotify, called "TakeOff," in 2015. His early songs were about praising God and Jesus and how they deserve to be celebrated and loved. Due to an apathetic attitude and other personal events, Montell tends to only release once per year. Montell keeps his morals which influences his direction in music; he continues to make music about God and faith, usually incorporating little parts into his songs. An example of this is when in "Destroy Myself Just For You" he incorporates a quote from Samuel 7:3-17 about "returning to the Lord with all your heart." The song is about how Montell destroys himself to stay on the track to follow God. He explains in the song, "Pray my salvation makes it to the pearly gates, Bring the suffering that I face." What he's focusing on is how he has to

deal with a lot of pain to make sure he's able to get into Heaven. Even through all the pain, he continues to worship God because of all that God has done for him.

Montell was influenced by many things to make music, but his main motivation was because of a variety of his life's experiences and problems. Examples of this are songs he's made like "Destroy Myself For You," and "Enough For You," early albums and EPs like *King David EP*, *Eternal Light EP*, *SomeWhereInTheForest*, and *As We Walk Into Forever*, were all released in 2015 and 2016. None of these EPs or albums gained much traction; this was because, compared to now, the quality of his voice in the songs and the beat were not as connected to the way Montell wanted to sing. As a fan, one thing stood out to me is that, even in his music before 2022, he still made slow, quiet, and relaxing music - even if it



wasn't music made at his full potential. When he released *Bedroom Gospel*, *It's Beautiful*, and *A Lo-Fi Christmas* in 2017 and 2018, he gained a small audience from these albums due to the increase in quality. Then he released the album *JAMIE* on July 22nd, 2022 and the album *Her Love Still Haunts Me Like a Ghost* on October 28th, 2022. These albums absolutely exploded Montell's career because of the amazing sound quality, deep lyrics, and style of the music. Some of the songs like "Fall In Love With You," "Destroy Myself Just For You," "Talk 2 Me," and "Hotel," accumulated hundreds of millions of views. Montell uses his music platform to express himself, and the meaning of the songs can be interpreted in different ways. Even though they are about his life, the lyrics can mean so many different things. Personally, the fact that I can listen to his music and I can connect myself with the song makes them even better. Montell's struggles with love, addiction, and



depression meant he was able to find motivation and structure for his music. It allowed him to express how he felt, and made a platform for him to spread his belief in his religion. A big part of his motivation and structure was what he listened to as a kid. The magazine article on highsnobiety.com explains that Montell gave good insight to his early music listening by saying, "With my dad I remember we listened to a lot of rap, Lil Wayne – Tha Carter III, specifically. A lot of Tupac - a mixture of R&B and soul and hip-hop. On my mom's side there was a lot of gospel, a lot of religious music." The article elaborates on this by saying that Montell was "inspired by world builders like Kid Cudi, Childish Gambino, Tyler The

Creator, and filmmaker Terrence Malick." He was connected to music at a young age and really enjoyed listening to the different genres which most likely played a role in him wanting to make his own. As seen by myself today, I can subtly pick up little resemblance to those artists in Montell's music. Highsnobiety states, "Montell's pursuit is to use his ability to communicate emotion by creating more mediums of communication." Highsnobiety.com also explains that, "As time went on and his work evolved, Fish began making collaborative projects with his label, Lord's Child, while continuing to build out his artistic identity." Which means he can express himself more and find who he is. Then, Montell added in a very crucial part into what his recent music is about. Still incorporating his faith, he also made music about his heartbreaks. Personally I'd say this was the best approach Montell has had yet, because this is when he released his best album JAMIE. Hypebeast.com - a website that has posted interviews with Montell from a range of publications quotes Montell saying, "I like to build worlds around every project," he said. "When I was rolling out JAMIE, I included a lot of weird loopholes, clues for my fans about who Jamie is and where she comes from." By adding a storyline and universe connected to his album JAMIE, he found a great way to explain how he felt while making it interesting for the listener. Montell's push to make music is his problems and experiences, but he also expresses himself through music because he loves what he does even if got burnt out for a while and might again.

In 2022, Montell released the album *Her Love Still Haunts Me Like a Ghost*. This album would be the opposite of his former slow, quiet, and religious music. It took a more sinful path, which angered many fans. Highsnobiety.com quotes Montell explaining, "My comment section can go pretty crazy.

Now a lot of Christians are mad at me because they think I'm too far gone like, 'Oh, no, he's not coming back. He's never being what we first imagined him to be." In my opinion, this criticism is undeserved. Music is a type of freedom that people use to express themselves meaning, they can say whatever comes to mind and make any type of music they want. Highsnobiety.com adds that Montell said, "But at the end of the day, I've always only done what's genuine to me. I'm not going to write about something that is not, I don't know, it doesn't drive me." Montell adds, "It's my therapy, so I have to be as genuine as possible." Montell has shown his maturity and explained how he's not going to change for other people, but he still decided to respond to the citisim. Billboard.com explains that Montell responded to the contreveries by saying, "No, I am not perfect. I fell many times, and I don't always get things right. Sometimes I do not always feel like



worshiping and sometimes I get led astray, but I will worship you anyways." Montell wanted to make different music, as he said, "I didn't want to make gospel or contemporary Christian music,"



Fish says, "So I began experimenting." I think this is an amazing approach because even though he's switching his music on to an audience that listened for his other songs, his new songs gained a great amount of traction. Additionally, he's still expressing himself and if he forces himself to just make gospel music even though he doesn't want to, he could get burnt out. Even if his new approach to music angered people, Montell knew what he wanted to do. Montell had a very thoughtful response, shared by Hyperbeast.com: "It's just my life," he says. "I can't hide much, and I'm just learning more and more that the only way you're gonna get far is if you are completely yourself." Excited by the previous angered fans, in

2023 he released the song "I Just Wanna Feel Your Love Again." This single followed the same style of *JAMIE*, than *Her Love Haunts Me Like a Ghost*. Even though he redeemed himself with the release of "I Just Wanna Feel Your Love Again," nobody knows if Montell will continue on this track with his music. Montell Fish's impact on music is how he helped grow the genre of newer gospel music, instead of classic high pitched or choir gospel. He also created music for listeners that have similar problems, and to give them calming music displaying relatable topics about God and the struggles of life.
